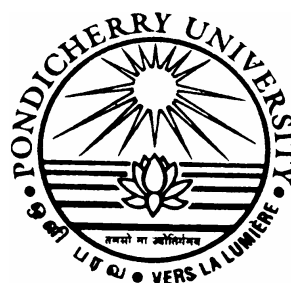

Internal auditors act as consultants to the organization, providing assurance on the organizations' risk management governance and internal control processes. Internal auditors deal with issues that are fundamentally important to the survival and prosperity of any organization. Internal audit is an ongoing and continuous process in addition to the external audit to verify and certify the entire Income and Expenditure and the Capital Expenditure of the University each year. Apart from internal audit, all the accounts of the institution are audited by the CAG regularly in two phases, i.e., certification of accounts and transaction audit looking into the procedural and performance aspects. The statutory auditors review the internal control mechanism, accounting policies, accounting standards, financial analysis and prepare the financial statements. Most of the audit observations are settled based on the convincing replies furnished by the University. The University invariably takes corrective measures in the next financial year on any observations made in the audit report.
