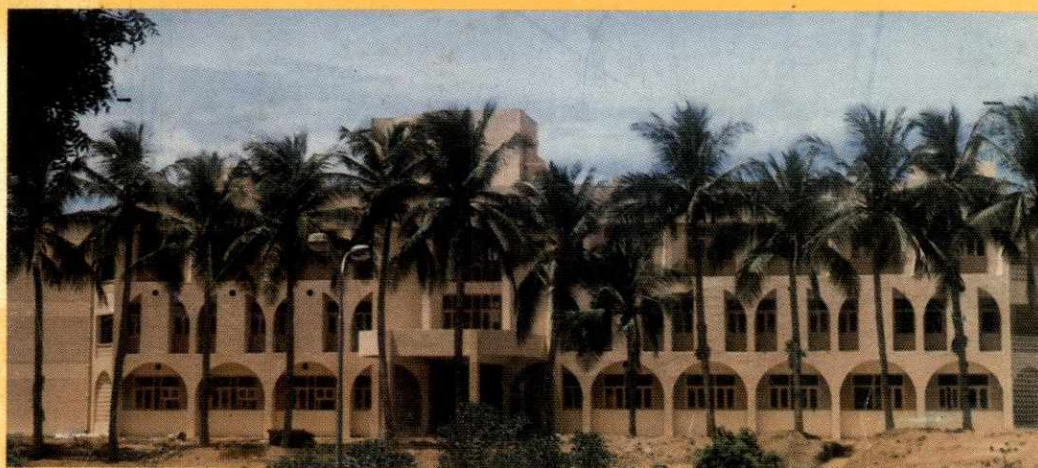

FOREWORD

Pondicherry University has made significant progress in a short span of 10 years in establishing itself as one of the leading seats of higher learning and continued to do so during the year under report. A resume of all the activities and other achievements of the University during the year 1995-96 are summarized in the chapter "Highlights of the year" and the details are elaborated in the subsequent chapters.

The academic sector-schools and departments - continued to maintain the high standards inspite of several constraints for their teaching and research. The University faculty strength which is hardly 135, has already attracted support for more than 82 research projects from various national and international agencies and their output in terms of quality publications are impressive. As many as 146 papers have been published by them during the course of the year. Besides, they have been invited to give lectures by various Universities and National Institutes. As many as 48 teachers have participated and presented papers in nearly 90 seminars and symposia held both in India and abroad. The University itself had organized 15 short term courses, seminars, symposia and conferences for the benefit of others.

The University administration including the Controller of Examinations Wing which caters to 20 affiliated institutions besides our University and its constituent departments and other units has been doing an excellent work and their record of fault-free functioning is indicative of their commitments.

The inventory of academic programmes listed in chapter 2, considering the early stage of its growth, this University can be considered as impressive in terms of diversity and wide choice available to the aspiring students.

We continue to have both annual and semester patterns of study though we have recently switched over to semester pattern in all of our affiliated institutions, during the year under report. The University examinations are conducted for all the students of both affiliated institutions and the University and results are declared as per the preplanned schedule.

The chapter 3 outlines the major developmental activities both in the realm of academic programmes and in the area of infrastructure. Several buildings and campus amenity works undertaken earlier have been successfully completed this year and put to use immediately.

In the subsequent chapters the details of the staff strength, extra curricular and extension activities, the special efforts made to encourage underprivileged students and the like are given.

Being a young University, the earlier efforts made to organize new schools and departments are to be consolidated and strengthened with various infrastructure and facilities. The report will highlight our efforts in this regard.

I thank the authorities of the University, the teaching and non-teaching staff, the students, the UGC, the Government of India and above all the Pondicherry Community for their co-operation and support.

1.1 GENERAL

Being a young university, the need for development is great. Nothing could be given low priority and consequently, the resources and efforts are continuously mobilized for developing infrastructural, academic and extension activities in the year 1995-96. The salient points of the various developmental efforts are summarized in this chapter.

1.2 ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

Schools, Departments and Centres

The University has 6 Schools, 15 Departments and 11 Centres.

Including the above courses, the Schools, Departments and Centres offered Ph.D. Programme in 22 disciplines, M.Phil Programme in 15 disciplines, PG Programme in 23 disciplines, PG Diploma in 2 disciplines, Certificate Programme in 1 discipline and Five year integrated Master's degree Programme in one discipline.

Admission:

The intake of students during the year 1995-96 was 560. Out of this SC/ST was 88.

Enrolment:

The enrolment of the students in this year was 1217 which includes 156 students belonging to SC/ST. The above enrolment includes 843 Post-Graduate students, 133 M.Phil. students, 228 Ph.D. students and 13 PG Diploma and Certificate students.

Hostel Students:

The strength of the students in the Hostel was 471 which includes 289 men students and 182 women students. Out of the total 58 were SC/ST students.

Faculty Position:

During the year under report 22 Professors, 54 Readers and 59 Lecturers were in different Schools, Departments and Centres.

Short-term courses/seminars/symposia conducted:

15 Short-term Courses, Seminars and Symposia were conducted in different schools, departments and centres of the University.

Seminars and Symposia attended by the Faculty:

48 Faculty members attended 90 seminars and symposia.

Invited Lectures Delivered:

47 Faculty members delivered 85 lectures in different institutions during the year under report.

Endowment Lectures:

Eight Endowment Lectures were conducted during the period under report for the benefit of the students and teachers.

1.3 RESEARCH PROGRAMMES

Doctoral Programme:

26 Research Scholars registered for the Ph.D programme during the year.

Publication:

11 faculty members published 15 books.

43 faculty members contributed 146 papers and they were published in reputed national and international journals during the year.

Research Projects:

During the year under report 82 sponsored research projects were under execution in the University Schools and Departments.

12 University level books writing project were also under execution during the year.

1.4 DEVELOPMENTAL ACTIVITIES

Plan allocation:

During the period under report the UGC has released so far Rs. 863.99 lakhs for various schemes out of VIII Plan allocation of Rs. 1016.00 lakhs.

Library:

During the period under report 8792 volumes of books were purchased. With these, the Central Library acquired 83,787 volumes of books and 3645 back volumes of journals and subscribed for 396 journals and periodicals.

Finance:

During the financial year 1995-96, the UGC sanctioned and released Rs. 464.79 lakhs as non-plan grant.

The actual expenditure under non-plan for the year 1995-96 and the BE for the year 1996-97 were Rs. 613.74 and Rs. 842.97 lakhs respectively.

1.5 AFFILIATED INSTITUTIONS

During the period under report affiliation was granted to the following new courses:

The Institutions offered a total number of 119 courses and there were 1,794 faculty members. A total of 11,254 students were on roll of all the affiliated Institutions, of whom 5,364 were women students and 1,347 were SC/ST students. The total number of Library books in all these Institutions stood at 5,77,269 and subscribed for 1,074 journals.

1.6 GENERAL INFORMATION

ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

2.1. Introduction

The University offered Ph.D programme in 22 disciplines, M.Tech programme in one discipline, M.Phil programme in 15 disciplines, PG programme in 23 disciplines, PG Diploma programme in 2 disciplines and Certificate course in 1 discipline in 6 Schools, 14 Departments and 13 Centres.

2.2. Admissions

The University reopened after summer vacation on 3rd July 1995. Advertisements for admission to various courses in the University were given in leading newspapers and admission tests were held for all the courses. Based on the performance in the written test, interview and previous academic record, students were admitted to various courses. Admission to all courses were completed as per schedule and the classes began on 10th July 1995. The details of admission in the first year and strength of the students in the subsequent years are given below.

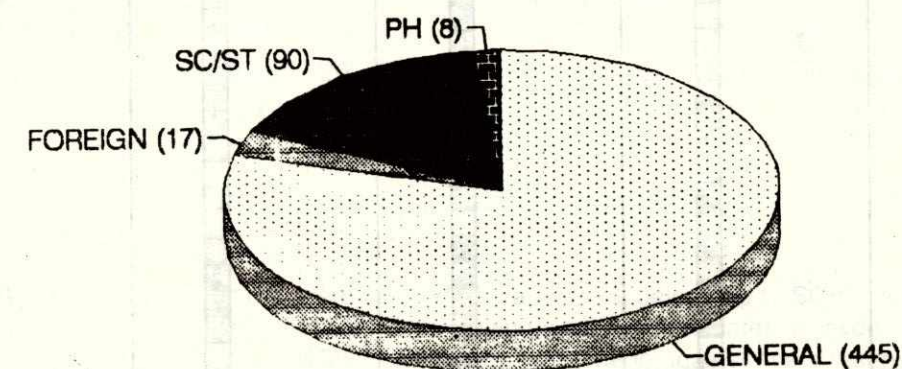

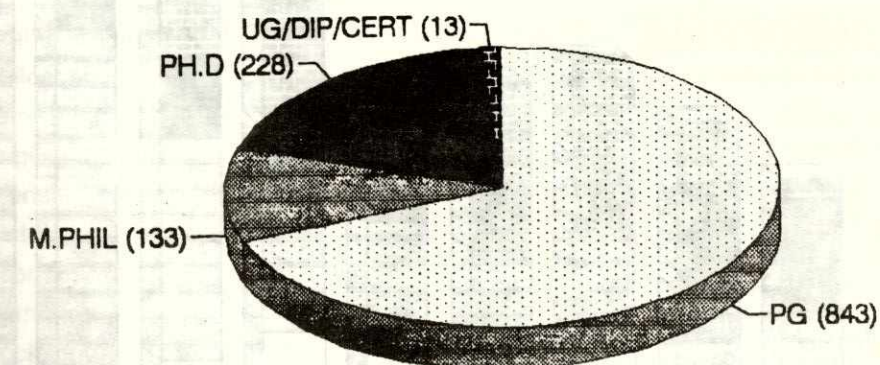

GENERAL AND OTHER CATEGORIES

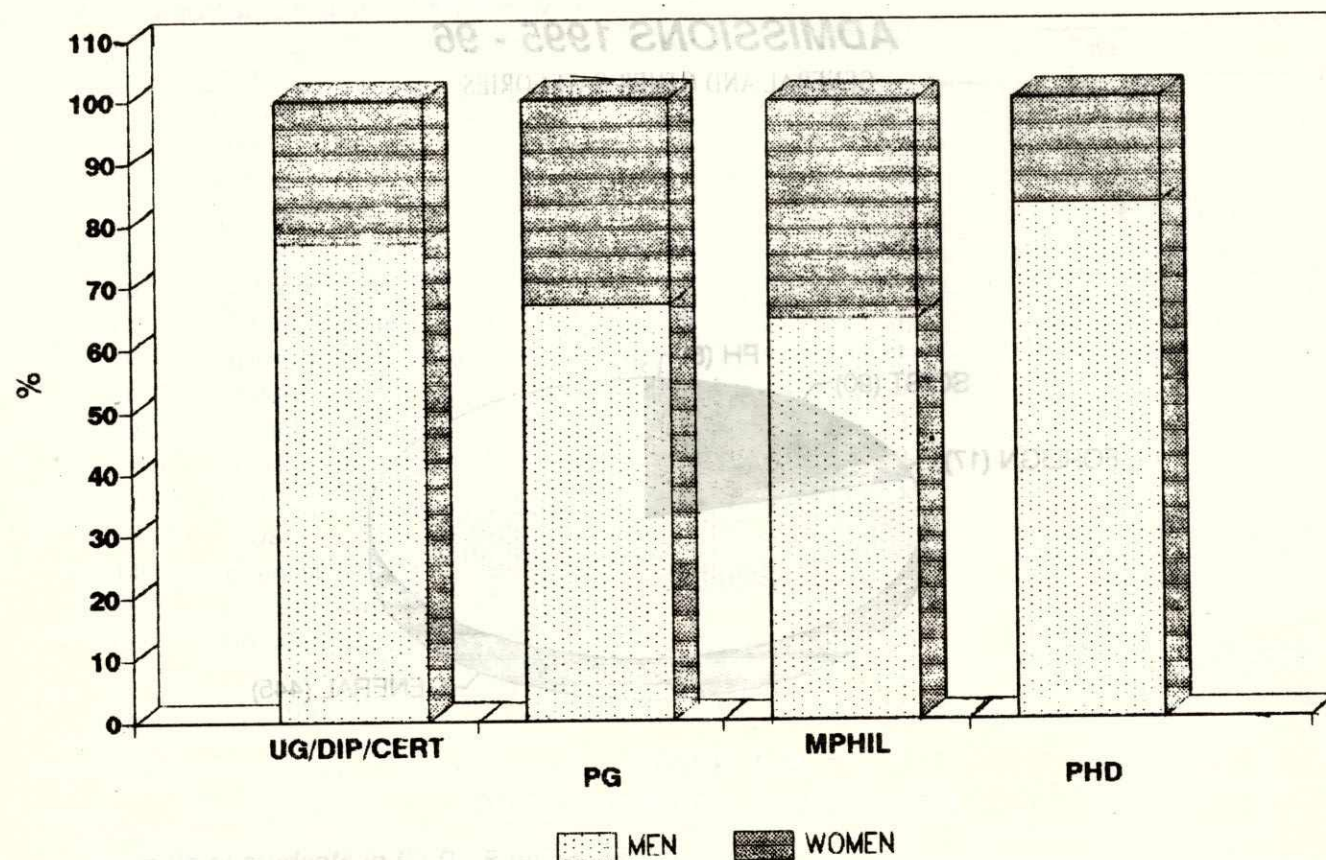


LEVELWISE COMPOSITION OF STUDENTS

1986-96

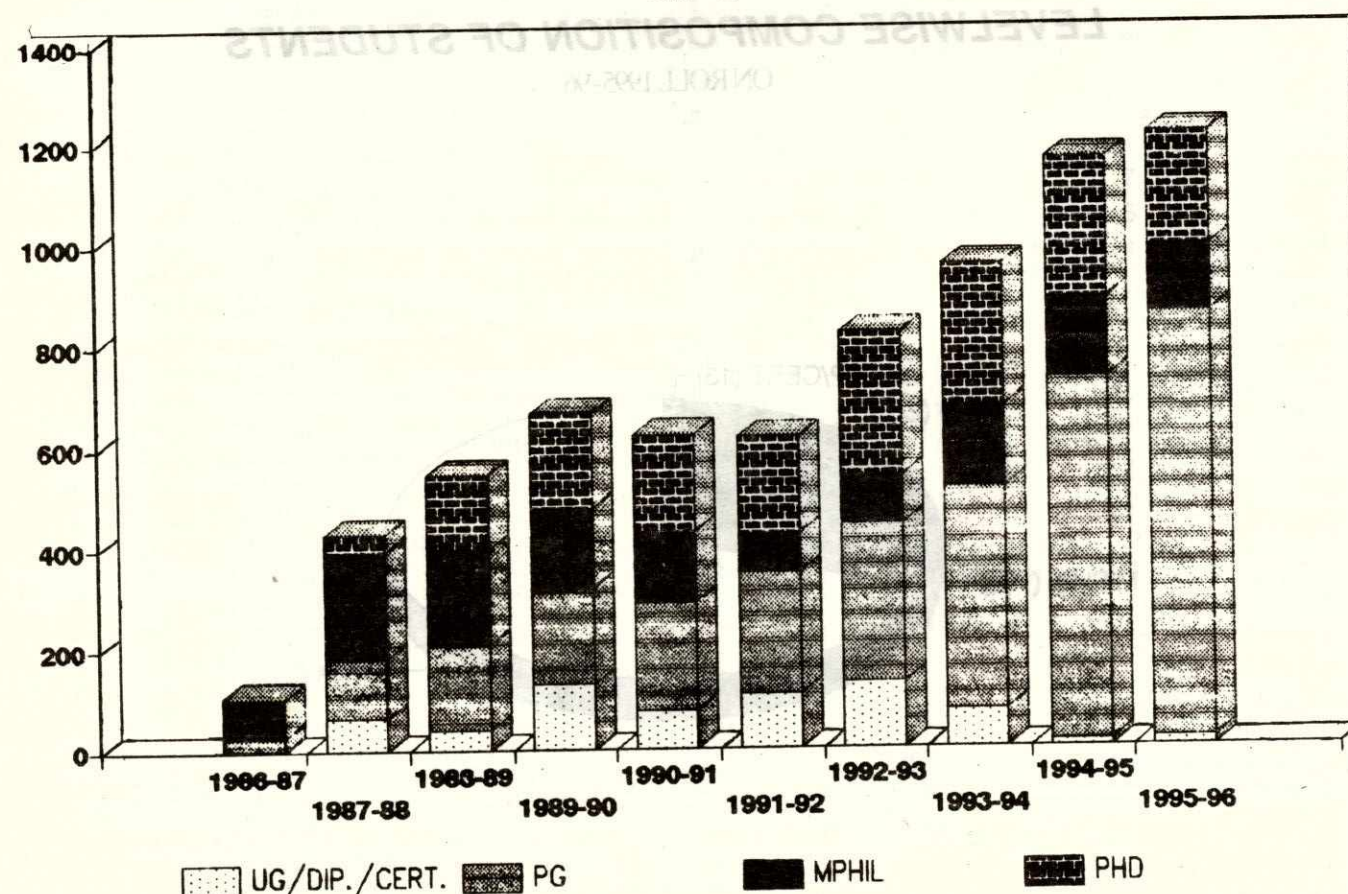

2.3. SC/ST Students

The minimum eligibility conditions were relaxed for candidates belonging to SC/ST enabling them to appear in admission tests. Separate merit lists were drawn up for the candidates in reserved categories in each of the courses and admissions of SC/ST candidates were made against seats reserved for them as per the prescribed percentage. 88 Candidates were admitted to various courses during the year 1995-96.

2.4. Conduct of Classes

The teaching and other academic activities were carried out throughout the year in a peaceful atmosphere without any disturbances.

2.5. Examination Results

The Examination Wing of the University conducted examinations for the courses of University and affiliated institutions. All the examinations were held as per the schedule.

3.7. Projects

During the period under report, projects were sanctioned, the details of which are given in Annexure-1. With this, 69 projects were under investigation in various departments.

3.8. Horticultural Operations

In addition to the normal horticultural activities, planting of new tree sapplings such as 400 nos. of teak, 750 nos. of coconut, fruit plants like mango, jack, pomegranate, lemon, sapota and wide varieties of new roses were procured at free of cost from the Government of Pondicherry and planted in the Campus. One number of low cost mini mist chamber was constructed for attending programmes and multiplication works of different kinds of exotic type plants.

3.9. Annual Report

The Annual Report 1994-95 of the University recommended by the Executive Council in its meeting held on 22.11.94 was approved by the Court in its meeting held on 27.11.95 and forwarded to the MHRD for placing the same in the Parliament. It was laid in the Parliament.

To help the students pursuing higher education, financial assistance is extended by various Organisations in the form of fellowship and scholarship. The details of fellowship and scholarships awarded to students during the period under report are given below:

2 UGC's Research Associateship

There are two Research Associates under UGC scheme, one Part-time Research Associateship at School of Performing Arts receiving a stipend @ Rs.2,200/- p.m. with annual contingent grant of Rs.5,000/- p.a. and another full-time Research Associateship at the Dept. of Ecology & Environmental Sciences receiving stipend of Rs.2,200/- p.m. with an annual contingency of Rs.10,000/- during the period under report.

3 Junior Research Fellowship

There are 28 JRFs during the period under report. The rate of fellowship is Rs.2,500/- p.m. for the first two years and the same is enhanced to Rs.2,800/- p.m. for the next two years subject to fulfilling certain conditions laid down by the Commission. The fellowship is also extended by one more year on the recommendations of the Guide/Head of the Department/School. They are also eligible for a contingent grant of Rs.5,000/- p.a. in case of Humanities and Social sciences and Rs.7,500/- in the case of Science subjects.

4 C.S.I.R. Junior/Senior Research Fellowship and Research Associateship

There are 4 CSIR JRFs & 5 Senior Research Fellows during the period under report. The JRF carries a fellowship of Rs. 2,500/- p.m. and SRF Rs.2,800/- p.m. Besides the fellowship, the scholars are eligible for a contingent grant of Rs.10,000/- p.a.

Three CSIR Research Associateship are available at the Centre for Pollution Control and Bio-waste Energy/Department of Chemistry availing associateship @ Rs.3,400/- Rs.3,000/- p.m. respectively and an annual contingent grant of Rs.10,000/- p.a.

5 Fellowship under the scheme of Tamil Language and Literature of Govt. of Pondicherry

There are three Ph.D scholars availing Govt. of Pondicherry fellowship under the scheme of Tamil Language and Literature. The value of fellowship is Rs. 800/- p.m. with an annual contingent grant of Rs. 3000/-.

6 N.B.H.M. Scholarship to M.Sc. Mathematics Students

The N.B.H.M., Bombay awarded one scholarship to M.Sc student at the Department of Mathematics. The value of Scholarship is @ Rs.1000/- p.m.

7 Government of India SC/ST Scholarship

The Government of Tamil Nadu, Pondicherry, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Orissa have sanctioned Government of India Scholarships to 63 students of SC Community for doing P.G. and M.Phil Programmes during the period under report.

8 Government of Pondicherry Scholarship

The Government of Pondicherry awarded 3 scholarships to the natives of Pondicherry enrolled in various courses of the University for the academic year 1995-96.

9 ICHR Study cum Travel grant

ICHR, New Delhi had awarded study cum travel grant to one M.Phil scholar in the Department of History.

6.10 ICCR Scholarship

ICCR, New Delhi has awarded 3 scholarships for the year 1995-96 to the scholars of Germany, Romania and Bangladesh under Indo-German, Romanian and Bangladesh Cultural Exchange Programmes.

6.11 Govt. of India National Scholarship of Tamilnadu

The Govt. of Tamilnadu has awarded Govt. of India National scholarship to 3 students of Tamilnadu, the period under report.

6.12 Union Territory of Lakshadweep scholarship

The Union Territory of Lakshadweep has awarded one scholarship to the Island student for the period under report.

6.13 National Scholarship of Union Territory of Delhi

The Union territory of Delhi has awarded one National scholarship to a student of Delhi for the period under report.

6.14 Govt. of India National Merit scholarship of Karnataka

The Govt of Karnataka has awarded 8 National Merit scholarship to the students of Karnataka.

STUDENTS AMENITIES AND ACTIVITIES

7.1. Hostel Accommodation

The two 60 Students hostels, one for MBA Students and the other for Students doing other courses and the two 120 students capacity hostels opened for Gents and Ladies and named as Kamban and Kavery are functioning in the University. These four hostels are sanctioned by the UGC as part of their seventh and eighth plan. Due to heavy pressure for accommodation for lady students, three type V and three type IV quarters were also provided for hostel purpose.

7.2. Hostel Administration

The University provided supporting staff to maintain hostel and hostel messes. The four hostels in the Campus is attached with the mess and each hostel has cook, Helper, Servers and Sweepers besides hostel office staff. Each hostel has a Deputy Warden and they are discharging their duties under the direction of Warden.

7.3. Hostel Mess

The Hostel Messes in the Campus are run by Mess Committees consisting of Students under the immediate supervision of Hostel warden. The Mess Committee members are elected by the Hostel residents periodically.

7.4. General Facilities

Each hostel is equipped with a colour television set, audio systems and facilities for indoor games such as Table Tennis, Chess and Carroms. Each hostel has a reading room. Important newspapers and magazines are supplied to each hostel. The University Health Centre offers medical facilities to the Students.

8.1. Introduction

One of the important objectives of the programme of the University Grants Commission is to enable those belonging to the weaker sections of the society benefit from the facilities provided for them. The Commission has sanctioned a Special Cell as a measure to strengthen the implementation machinery which plans programmes for the welfare of SC/ST communities in this University.

The Special Cell was started in 1987 with the following staff which evaluates and monitors the schemes to be implemented:

This cell took all measures to find out whether all the schemes of the University pertaining to the welfare of the SC/ST and Physically Handicapped categories are fully implemented. In addition, this cell also looks after the redressal of grievances of the SC/ST employees in this University.

8.2. Reservation for SC/ST and Physically Handicapped Candidates

As per the orders of the Government of India and the guidelines of the UGC with regard to reservation of seats for admission to candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Physically Handicapped categories, 15%, 7.5% and 3% of the total number of seats in each course have been reserved for Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribes, and Physically Handicapped students respectively. There is also provision for interchangeability of seats between Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates.

As per the Government of India's guidelines candidates belonging to SC/ST categories are to be given a concession of 5% of marks in the qualifying examination prescribed for admission. If seats reserved for them still remain unfilled, further relaxation should be given in order of merit among such candidates so that all the reserved seats may be filled. But as far as this University is concerned the candidates from SC/ST communities are considered for admission **even if they possess a mere pass in the respective qualifying examination prescribed for admission**. Their cases are considered for admission according to the merit in the entrance test, among the Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes candidates. The Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe and Visually handicapped candidates are exempted from the payment of application fees for all the courses being offered in this University and also while applying for various posts.

Three percent of seats in each course are reserved for candidates from physically handicapped categories. During the academic year 1995-96, eight such students were admitted.

As per the guidelines of the University Grants Commission, a Standing Committee has been constituted to review the implementation of policies and programme for Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes in Pondicherry University. Such a Committee has also been constituted in each of the affiliated institutions. The Standing Committee at the University level meets periodically every year.

The Deans of Schools and the Heads of Departments of this University and the Principals of the affiliated institutions were requested to follow strictly the guidelines of the Govt. of India and the UGC in respect of recruitment are also being followed in this University. Instructions and guidelines received in this regard from the UGC/Ministry of Human Resource Development were circulated among the affiliated colleges/institutions then and there.

8.3. Admissions

During the period under report there were 560 students on the Roll in the first year in various courses of this University out of which 88 students belonged to SC/ST communities.

The details regarding the number of seats reserved, the number of candidates selected and admitted are given in Annexure-I. Particulars regarding admission of SC/ST candidates since 1986-87 are given in Annexure-II.

8.4. Scholarships

The respective State Government sanctioned the Govt. of India scholarship for the candidates belonging to the SC/ST communities, as per the guidelines of the award of scholarship. The scholarship includes reimbursement of examination and other non-refundable fees, besides the mess fees at the permitted hostel rates.

The details regarding the award of scholarship to the SC/ST students in the University during the academic year 1995-96 are given in Annexure-III.

8.5. Women Students

Out of 560 students admitted during the academic year 1995-96 in various first year courses in this University 188 students were women. This accounts to over 31% of the total admission. The details regarding admission of women students in various courses during the period under report are given in Annexure-IV.

9.1. UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

The University Central Library serves the students, research scholars, members of the faculty and teaching staff of the University. It functions on all the seven days of the week from 9.30 a.m. to 8.30 p.m. week days and from 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. on weekly and other holidays. Reprographic and Photo copy facilities and CD-ROM Database access service are provided to the students, research scholars and faculty. The University Library had a collection of 83,787 books and 3,645 back volumes of journals & 396 current journals were subscribed for the year 1995-96.

Grants:

An expenditure of Rs.7,22,957/- was incurred for purchase of Books under Plan grant. A sum of Rs.18,17,468/- was spent during 1995-96 for renewal of journals subscription under Non-Plan grants.

U.N. Deposit Library:

The Library was recognised by the United Nations Organisation as its Deposit Centre.

Membership:

The Library had a total of 2984 members on its roll including the Students, Research Scholars, Faculty Officers and Non-Teaching Staff of the University. A number of persons from other institutions have also used the Library for their research/study purpose-entrepreneurial purpose.

Inter-Library Loan:

The University Library arranges to get books and other information which are not available in our Library on loan from other University libraries through Inter-Library loan system.

Binding:

3645 Nos. of Back-volumes of journals were bound and kept for the use of students, Research Scholars and Faculty during the period under report.

Computer application to the Library:

The Library has purchased and installed the Computer system and CD-ROM Network Service (search drives) was very much useful for research scholars, faculty and students. Bibliographic data of Books, The Library and Journal Holdings were computerised by using CDS/ISIS software.

9.2. COMPUTER CENTRE

The following items of computer systems were available in the Computer Unit

The Financial year of the University corresponds with that of the Government of India (i.e) 1st April to 31st March of the subsequent year. The accounts of the University are annually audited by the Office of the Accountant General-Audit (Tamilnadu & Pondicherry), Madras on behalf of the Comptroller & Audit General of India. In accordance with the instructions of the Government of India the audited accounts are required to be placed before the Parliament by 31st December of the following year.
