#### FOREWORD

Pondicherry University has made significant progress in a short span of 10 years in establishing itself as one of the leading seats of higher learning and continued to do so during the year under report. A resume of all the activities and other achievements of the University during the year 1995-96 are summarized in the chapter "Highlights of the year" and the details are elaborated in the subsequent chapters.

The academic sector-schools and departments - continued to maintain the high standards inspite of several constraints for their teaching and research. The University faculty strength which is hardly 135, has already attracted support for more than 82 research projects from various national and international agencies and their output in terms of quality publications are impressive. As many as 146 papers have been published by them during the course of the year. Besides, they have been invited to give lectures by various Universities and National Institutes. As many as 48 teachers have participated and presented papers in nearly 90 seminars and symposia held both in India and abroad. The University itself had organized 15 short term courses, seminars, symposia and conferences for the benefit of others.

The University administration including the Controller of Examinations Wing which caters to 20 affiliated institutions besides our University and its constituent departments and other units has been doing an excellent work and their record of fault-free functioning is indicative of their commitments.

The inventory of academic programmes listed in chapter 2, considering the early stage of its growth, this University can be considered as impressive in terms of diversity and wide choice available to the aspiring students.

We continue to have both annual and semester patterns of study though we have recently switched over to semester pattern in all of our affiliated institutions, during the year under report. The University examinations are conducted for all the students of both affiliated institutions and the University and results are declared as per the preplanned schedule.

#### 2.3. SC/ST Students

The minimum eligibility conditions were relaxed for candidates belonging to SC/ST enabling them to appear in admission tests. Separate merit lists were drawn up for the candidates in reserved categories in each of the courses and admissions of SC/ST candidates were made against seats reserved for them as per the prescribed percentage. 88 Candidates were admitted to various courses during the year 1995-96.

#### 2.4. Conduct of Classes

The teaching and other academic activities were carried out throughout the year in a peaceful atmosphere without any disturbances.

#### 2.5. Examination Results

The Examination Wing of the University conducted examinations for the courses of University and affiliated institutions. All the examinations were held as per the schedule.

- IV. Construction of Compound Wall at Andaman & Nicobar Islands at a total cost of Rs. 8.02 lakhs.
- v. Construction of Vice-Chancellor's residence at a total cost of Rs.15.59 lakhs
- vi. Construction of Guest House-cum-Convention Centre at a cost of Rs.150 lakhs (Phase-I) Environment clerance awaited
- vii. Combined building for Additional class room complex, M.Sc. Ecology and Library Annexe building at a total cost of Rs.71 lakhs
- viii. Construction of Women's Hostel under Special scheme at a total cost of Rs.16.66 lakhs

The UGC has sanctioned a sum of Rs.5,33,778/- as matching grant for the additional resources mobilised by the University during the years 1993-94 and 1994-95.

#### 3.7. Projects

During the period under report, projects were sanctioned, the details of which are given in Annexure-1. With this, 69 projects were under investigation in various departments.

## 3.8. Horticultual Operations

In addition to the normal horticultural activities, planting of new tree sapplings such as 400 nos. of teak, 750 nos. of coconut, fruit plants like mango, jack, pomegranate, lemon, sapota and wide varieties of new roses were procured at free of cost from the Government of Pondicherry and planted in the Campus. One number of low cost mini mist chamber was constructed for attending programmes and multiplication works of different kinds of exotic type plants.

## 3.9. Annual Report

The respective State Government sanctioned the Govt. of India scholarship for the candidates belonging The Special Cell was started in 1987 with the following staff which evaluates and monitors the schemo the SC/ST communities, as per the guidelines of the award of scholarship. The scholarship includes embursement of examination and other non-refundable fees, besides the mess fees at the permitted hostel ates.

#### .5. Women Students

Out of 560 students admitted during the academic year 1995-96 in various first year courses in this Iniversity 188 students were women. This accounts to over 31% of the total admission. The details regarding dmission of women students in various courses during the period under report are given in Annexure-IV.

This cell took all measures to find out whether all the schemes of the University pertaining to the welfa of the SC/ST and Physically Handicapped categories are fully implemented. In addition, this cell also look after the redressal of grievances of the SC/ST employees in this University.

## 8.2. Reservation for SC/ST and Physically Handicapped Candidates

As per the orders of the Government of India and the guidelines of the UGC with regard to reservat of seats for admission to candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Physica Handicapped categories, 15%, 7.5% and 3% of the total number of seats in each course have been resen for Scheduled Cates, Scheduled Tribes, and Physically Handicapped students respectively. There is a provision for interchangeability of seats between Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates.

As per the Government of India's guidelines candidates belonging to SC/ST categories are to be give a concession of 5% of marks in the qualifying examination prescribed for admission. If seats reserved for the still remain unfilled, further relaxation should be given in order of merit among such candidates so that all reserved seats may be filled. But as far as this University is concerned the candidates from SC/ST community are considered for admission even if they posses a mere pass in the respective qualifying examination prescribed for admission. Their cases are considered for admission according to the merit in the entra test, among the Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes candidates. The Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe a Visually handicapped candidates are exempted from the payment of application fees for all the courses be offered in this University and also while applying for various posts.

Three percent of seats in each course are reserved for candidates from physically handicapped catego During the academic year 1995-96, eight such students were admitted.

As per the guidelines of the University Grants Commission, a Standing Committee has been constitut to review the implementation of policies and programme for Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes in Pondich University . Such a Committee has also been constituted in each of the affiliated institutions. The Stand Committee at the University level meets periodically every year.
