

FOREWORD

Pondicherry University has made significant progress in a short span of 11 years in establishing itself as one of the leading seats of higher learning and continued to do so during the year under report. A resume of all the activities and other achievements of the University during the year 1996-97 are summarized in the chapter "Highlights of the year" and the details are elaborated in the subsequent chapters.

Pondicherry University has introduced 5 Year Integrated M.Sc. Course in Science subjects comprising Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics in addition to the already introduced 5 Year Integrated M.A. Programme in Tamil. The ambition is to catch the Scholars at the young stage, to train them as dedicated Scientists, fully involving their talents.

Pondicherry University has also commissioned "Internal Quality Assurance Cell" during the year 1996-97 and it has started functioning by getting evaluation reports from teachers and students. It is proposed to develop it as a full-fledged organisation to improve the quality of education in all respects.

The academic sector-schools and departments - continued to maintain the high standards inspite of several constraints for their teaching and research. The University faculty strength which is hardly 141, has already attracted support for more than 93 research projects from various national and international agencies and their output in terms of quality publications are impressive. As many as 149 papers have been published by them during the course of the year. Besides, they have been invited to give lectures by various Universities and National Institutes. As many as 79 teachers have participated and presented papers in nearly 107 seminars and symposia held both in India and abroad. The University itself had organized 31 short term courses, seminars, symposia and conferences for the benefit of others.

The University administration including the Controller of Examinations Wing which caters to 20 affiliated institutions besides our University and its constituent departments and other units has been doing an excellent work and their record of fault-free functioning is indicative of their commitments.

The inventory of academic programmes listed in chapter 2, considering the early stage of its growth, this University can be considered as impressive in terms of diversity and wide choice available to the aspiring students.

We continue to have both annual and semester patterns of study though we have recently switched over to semester pattern in all of our affiliated institutions, during the year under report. The University examinations are conducted for all the students of both affiliated institutions and the University and results are declared as per the preplanned schedule.

The chapter 3 outlines the major developmental activities both in the realm of academic programmes and in the area of infrastructure. Several buildings and campus amenity works undertaken earlier have been successfully completed this year and put to use immediately.

In the subsequent chapters the details of the staff strength, extra curricular and extension activities, the special efforts made to encourage underprivileged students and the like are given.

Being a young University, the earlier efforts made to organize new schools and departments are to be consolidated and strengthened with various infrastructure and facilities. The report will high light our efforts in this regard.

I thank the authorities of the University, the teaching and non-teaching staff, the students, the Departments and Centres. UGC, the Government of India and above all the Pondicherry Community for their co-operation Short-term courses/seminars/symposia conducted and support.

Being a young university, the need for development is great. Nothing could be given low priority and consequently, the resources and efforts are continuously mobilized for developing infrastructural, academic and extension activities in the year 1996-97. The salient points of the various developmental efforts are summarized in this chapter.

Including the above courses, the Schools, Departments and Centres offered Ph.D. Programme in 22 disciplines, M.Phil Programme in 17 disciplines, M.Tech. in one discipline, PG Programme in 27 subjects, disciplines, PG Diploma in 3 disciplines, Certificate Programme in 1 discipline and Five year integrated Master's degree Programme in four disciplines.

Admission

The intake of students during the year 1996-97 was 580. Out of this SC/ST was 82.

The enrolment of the students in this year was 1246 which includes 181 students belonging to SC/ST. The above enrolment includes 906 Post-Graduate students, 100 M.Phil. students, 211 Ph.D. students and 29 PG Diploma and Certificate students.

Hostel Students

The strength of the students in the Hostel was 494 which includes 299 men students and 195 women students. Out of the total 73 were SC/ST students.

Faculty Position

During the year under report 25 Professors, 56 Readers and 60 Lecturers were in different Schools






ADMISSIONS 1996 - 97 GENERAL AND OTHER CATEGORIES




LEVELWISE COMPOSITION OF STUDENTS ON ROLL 1996-97

Important newspapers and magazines are supplied to each hostel. The University Health Centre offers medical facilities to the Students.

SPECIAL FACILITIES TO SC/ST AND WOMEN STUDENTS

Introduction

One of the important objectives of the programme of the University Grants Commission is to enable 8.1. those belonging to the weaker sections of the society benefit from the facilities provided for them. The Commission has sanctioned a Speical Cell as a measure to strengthen the implementation machinary which plans the programmes for the welfare of SC/ST communities in this University.

The Special Cell was started in 1987 with the following staff which evaluates and monitors the e following are the details of accommodation proschemes to be implemented:

Deputy Registrar 1, Section Officer 1, Statistical Assistant 1, Steno-Typist 1, Junior Assistant 1 and Peon 1

This cell took all measures to find out whether all the schemes of the University pertaining to the welfare of the SC/ST and Physically Handicapped categories are fully implemented. In addition, this cell also looked after the redressal of grievances of the SC/ST employees in this University.

Reservation For SC/ST And Physically Handicapped Candidates 8.2.

As per the orders of the Government of India and the guidelines of the UGC with regard to reservation of seats for admission to candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Physically Handicapped categories, 15%, 7.5% and 3% of the total number of seats in each course have been reserved for Scheduled Cates, Scheduled Tribes, and Physically Handicapped students respectively. There is also provision for interchangeability of seats between Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates.

As per the Government of India's guidelines candidates belonging to SC/ST categories are to be given a concession of 5% of marks in the qualifying examination prescribed for admission. If seats reserved for them still remain unfilled, further relaxation should be given in order of merit among such candidates so that all the reserved seats may be filled. But as far as this University is concerned the candidates from SC/ST communities are considered for admission even if they posses a mere pass in the respective qualifying examinations prescribed for admission. Their cases are considered for admission according to the merit in the entrance test, among the Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes candidates. The Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe and Visually handicapped candidates are exempted from the payment of application fees for all the courses being offered in this University and also while applying for various posts.

Three percent of seats in each course are reserved for candidates from physically handicapped category. During the academic year 1996-97, Nine such students were admitted.

As per the guidelines of the University Grants Commission, a Standing Committee has been constituted to review the implementation of policies and programme for Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes in Pondicherry University . Such a Committee has also been constituted in each of the affiliated institutions. The Standing Committee at the University level meets periodically every year.

The Deans of Schools and the Heads of Departments of this University and the Principals of the affiliated institutions were requested to follow strictly the guidelines of the Govt. of India and the UGC in respect of recruitment are also being followed in this University. Instructions and guidelines received in this regard from the UGC/Ministry of Human Resource Development were circulated among the affiliated colleges/ institutions then and there.

8.3. Admissions

During the period under report there were 580 students on the Roll in the first year in various courses of this University out of which 82 students belonged to SC/ST communities.

The details regarding the number of seats reserved, the number of candidates selected and admitted are given in Annexure-I. Particulars regarding admission of SC/ST candidates since 1986-87 are given in Annexure-II.

8.4. Scholarships

The respective State Government sanctioned the Govt. of India scholarship for the candidates belonging to the SC/ST communities, as per the guidelines of the award of scholarship. The scholarship includes reimbursement of examination and other non-refundable fees, besides the mess fees at the permitted hostel

The details regarding the award of scholarship to the SC/ST students in the University during the academic year 1996-97 are given in Annexure-III.

8.5. Women Students

Out of 580 students admitted during the academic year 1996-97 in various first year courses in this University 200 students were women. This accounts to over 31% of the total admission. The details regarding admission of women students in various courses during the period under report are given in Annexure-IV.

CENTRAL FACILITIES

9.1. UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

The University Central Library serves the students, research scholars, members of the faculty and non teaching staff of the University. It functions on all the seven days of the week from 9.30 a.m. to 8.30 p.m. on week days and from 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. on weekly and other holidays. Reprographic and Photo copying facilities and CD-ROM Database access service are provided to the students, research scholars and faculty. The University Library had a collection of 85,781 books and 4,563 back volumes of journals & 397 current journals were subscribed for the year 1996-97.

Grants

An expenditure of Rs.25 lakhs was incurred for purchase of Books under Plan grant. Rs.4.53 lakhs and Rs.11.14 lakhs have been incurred for purchase of books under Specific Schemes and UGC Special grant. A sum of Rs.14.55 lakhs was spent during 1996-97 for renewal of journals subscription under Non-Plan grants.

U.N. Deposit Library

The Library was recognised by the United Nations Organisation as its Deposit Centre.

Membership

The Library had a total of 3419 members on its roll including the Students, Research Scholars, Faculty, Officers and Non-Teaching Staff of the University. A number of persons from other institutions have also used the Library for their research/study prupose-entrepreneurial purpose.

Inter-Library Loan

The University Library arranges to get books and other information which are not available in our Library, on loan from other University libraries through Inter-Library loan system.

Binding

4563 Nos. of Back-volumes of journals were bound and kept for the use of students, Research Scholars and Faculty during the period under report.

Computer application to the Library

The Library has purchased and installed the Computer system and CD-ROM Network Service (seven drives) was very much useful for research scholars, faculty and students. Bibliographic data of Books, Theses and Journal Holdings were computerised by using CDS/ISIS software.

Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC)

The University Library is creating a computerised databases as follows:

Books - 50,000 records, Theses - 600 records and Serial Holdings - 600 records.

These databases can be accessed by the user in what is called Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) by using the computer terminal kept in the Library separately for the purpose. COPSAT (Contents of Periodicals in Science and Technology) a database in floppy medium is also available.
