FOREWORD

I have great pleasure in presenting the eighth annual report 1993-94 of the Pondicherry University. The University has made remarkable progress in a short span of time in establishing itself as one of the leading centres of higher learning and continued to do so during the year under report. The major achievements and activities of the University in the year 1993-94 are summarized in the chapter "Highlights of the year" and the details are elaborated in the subsequent chapters.

The academic sector-schools and departments - continued to maintain the high standards inspite of several infrastructural constraints for their teaching and research. The University faculty strength which is hardly 129, has already attracted support for more than 50 research projects from various national and international agencies and their output in terms of quality publications are impressive. As many as 126 papers have been published by them during the course of the year. Besides, they have been invited to give more than 148 lectures by various Universities and National Institutes. As many as 22 teachers have participated and presented papers in nearly 48 seminars and symposia held both in India and abroad. The University itself had organized about 15 short term courses, seminars and conferences for the benefit of others.

The University administration including the Controller of Examinations Wing which caters to 19 affiliated institutions besides our University has been doing an excellent work and their record of fault-free functioning is indicative of their commitments.

The inventory of academic programmes listed in chapter 2, considering the early stage of its establishment of this University, can be considered as impressive in terms of diversity and wide choice available to the aspiring students. The Choice Based Credit System is extended to M.Phil. during this year.


We continue to have both annual and semester patterns of study in the affiliated institutions and the University examinations are conducted for all the students and the results declared as per schedule.

The chapter 3 outlines the major developmental activities both in the realm of academic programmes and in the area of infrastructure. Several buildings and campus amenity works undertaken earlier have been successfully completed this year and put to use immediately. Under VIII Plan new building works, the major academic complex at an estimated cost of Rs. 345.74 lakhs were approved and assigned to CPWD. Two hostels to accomodate 120 each for boys and girls have been since completed.

In the subsequent chapters the details of the staff strength, extra curricular and extension activities, the special efforts made to encourage underprivileged students and the like are given.

Being a young University, the earlier efforts made to organize new schools and departments are to be consolidated and strengthened with various infrastructure and facilities. The report will high light our efforts in this regard.

I thank the authorities of the University, the teaching and non-teaching staff, the students, the Government of India, the UGC and above all the Pondicherry Community for their co-operation and support.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

1

1.1 GENERAL

Being a young university, it strived its best to meet the challenging developmental needs. Nothing could be given low priority and consequently, sincere efforts were taken to mobilize resources for developing infrastructural facilities, for providing new academic inputs and promoting research and extension activities in the year 1993-94. The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) introduced in 1992-93 was consolidated and strengthened. It was extended to M.Phil. programme also. An attempt in net-working Universities through MOUs was continued. The salient points of the various developmental efforts are summarised in this chapter.

1.2 ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

Schools, Departments and Centres:

The University has 6 Schools, 14 Departments and 7 Centres.

New Courses:

The following new courses were introduced:

M.I.M Master of International Management

M.C.A. Master of Computer Application

M.Tech. Computer Science

Including the above courses, the Schools, Departments and Centres offered Ph.D. programme in 21 disciplines, M.Phil. programme in 16 disciplines, PG programme in 21 disciplines, PG Diploma in 3 disciplines, Certificate programme in 3 disciplines and Five year integrated Master's Degree programme in one discipline.

Admission:

The intake of students during the year 1993-94 was 487. Out of this SC/ST was 49.

Enrolment:

The enrolment of the students in this year was 958 which includes 91 students belonging to SC/ST. The above enrolment includes 442 Post-Graduate students, 161 M.Phil. students, 282 Ph.D. students, 73 PG Diploma and Certificate students.

Hostel Students:

The strength of the students in the Hostel was 193 which includes 117 men students and 76 women students. Out of the total, 29 were SC/ST students.

Faculty Position:

During the year under report 24 Professors, 50 Readers and 61 Lecturers were in different Schools, Departments and Centres.

Short-term courses/seminars/symposia conducted:

15 Short-term Courses, Seminars and Symposia were conducted in different schools, departments and centres of the University.

Seminars and Symposia attended by the Faculty:

22 Faculty members attended 48 seminars and symposia.

Invited Lectures Delivered:

56 Faculty members delivered 148 lectures in different institutions during the year under report.

Endowment Lectures:

Seven Endowment Lectures were conducted during the period under report for the benefit of the students, teachers and the public.

1.3 RESEARCH PROGRAMMES

Doctoral Programme:

22 Research Scholars registered for the Ph.D programme during the year.

Publication:

18 Faculty members published 29 books. 48 faculty members contributed 126 papers and they were published in reputed national and international journals during the year.

Research Projects:

During the year under report 50 sponsored research projects were under execution in the University Schools and Departments.

1.4 DEVELOPMENTAL ACTIVITIES

Plan allocation:

During the period under report the UGC has released Rs.180.45 lakhs for various schemes under VIII Plan.

Building Works:

Two hostels, one for Men and the other for Women to accommodate totally 240 students were completed and kept ready for the next academic year. Construction of one Animal House and a Farm House were also completed. The major academic complex at an estimated cost of Rs. 345.74 lakhs was got approved and assigned to the CPWD.

Library:

During the period under report 1460 volumes of books were purchased. With these the Central Library acquired 69,889 volumes of books and subscribed for 475 journals and periodicals.

Finance:

During the financial year 1993-94, the UGC sanctioned and released Rs.444.82 lakhs as non-plan grant, which includes Rs. 100 lakhs for purchase of books, back volume and infrastructural facilities, as one time additional grant.

The actual expenditure under non-plan for the year 1993-94 and the BE for the year 1994-95 were Rs.451.19 and Rs.607.02 lakhs respectively.

The Institutions offered a total number of 113 courses. A total of 9,414 students were on rolls in all the affiliated Institutions, of whom 4,317 were women students and 816 were SC/ST students. The total number of Library books in all these Institutions stood at 4,63,227 and they subscribed 1,576 journals.

ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

2.1. INTRODUCTION

The University offered Ph.D programme in 21 disciplines, M.Tech in one programme, M.Phil programme in 16 disciplines, PG programme in 21 disciplines, PG Diploma programme in 3 disciplines and Certificate course in 3 disciplines in 6 Schools, 14 Departments and 7 Centres.

2.2. ADMISSIONS

The University reopened after summer vacation on 1st July 1993. Advertisements for admission to various courses in the University were given in leading newspapers and admission tests were held for all the courses. Based on the performance in the written test, interview and previous academic record, students were admitted to various courses. Admission to all courses were completed as per schedule and the classes began on 1st July 1993. The details of admission in the first year and strength of the students in the subsequent years are given below.

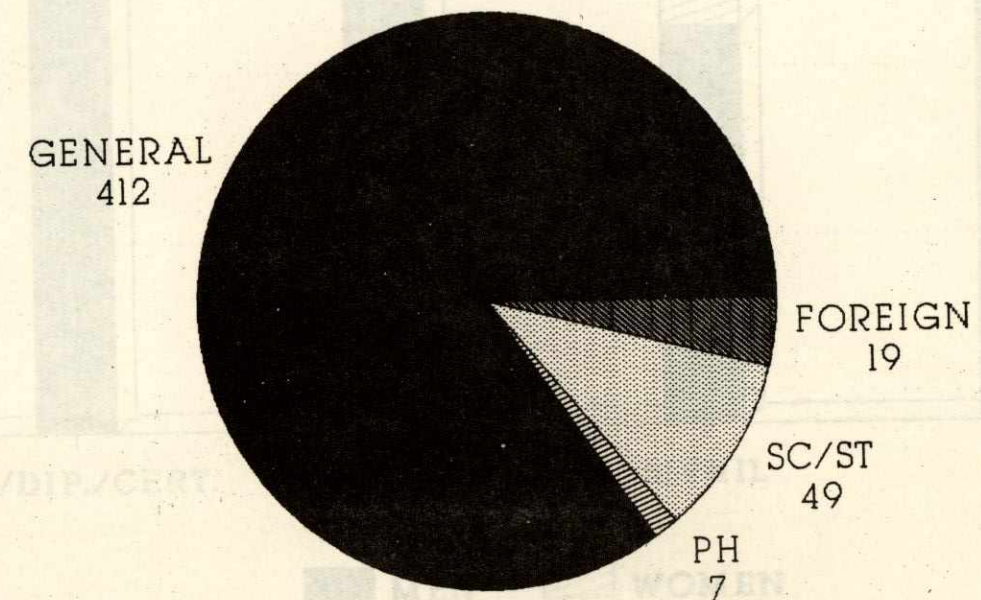

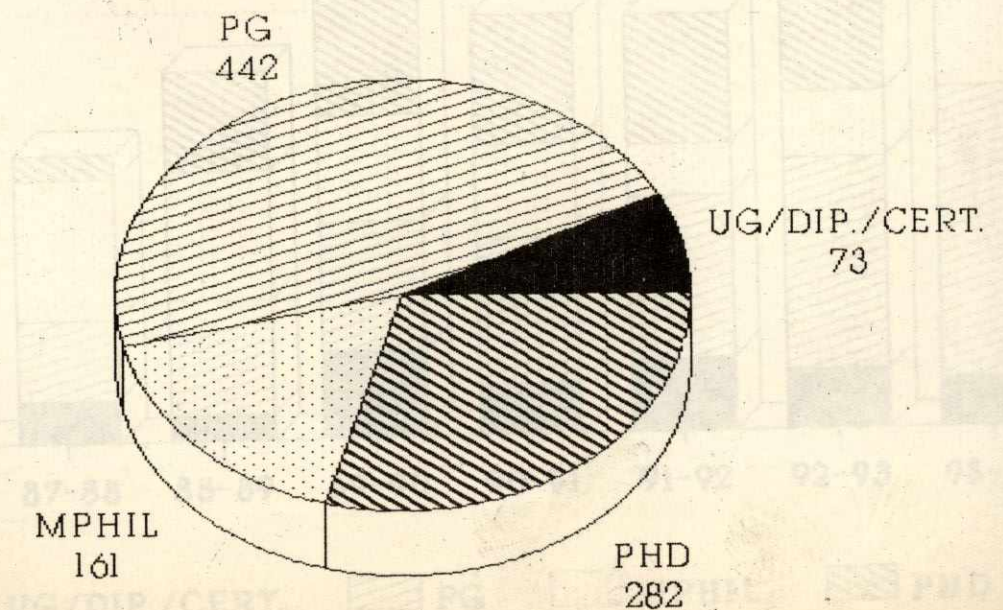

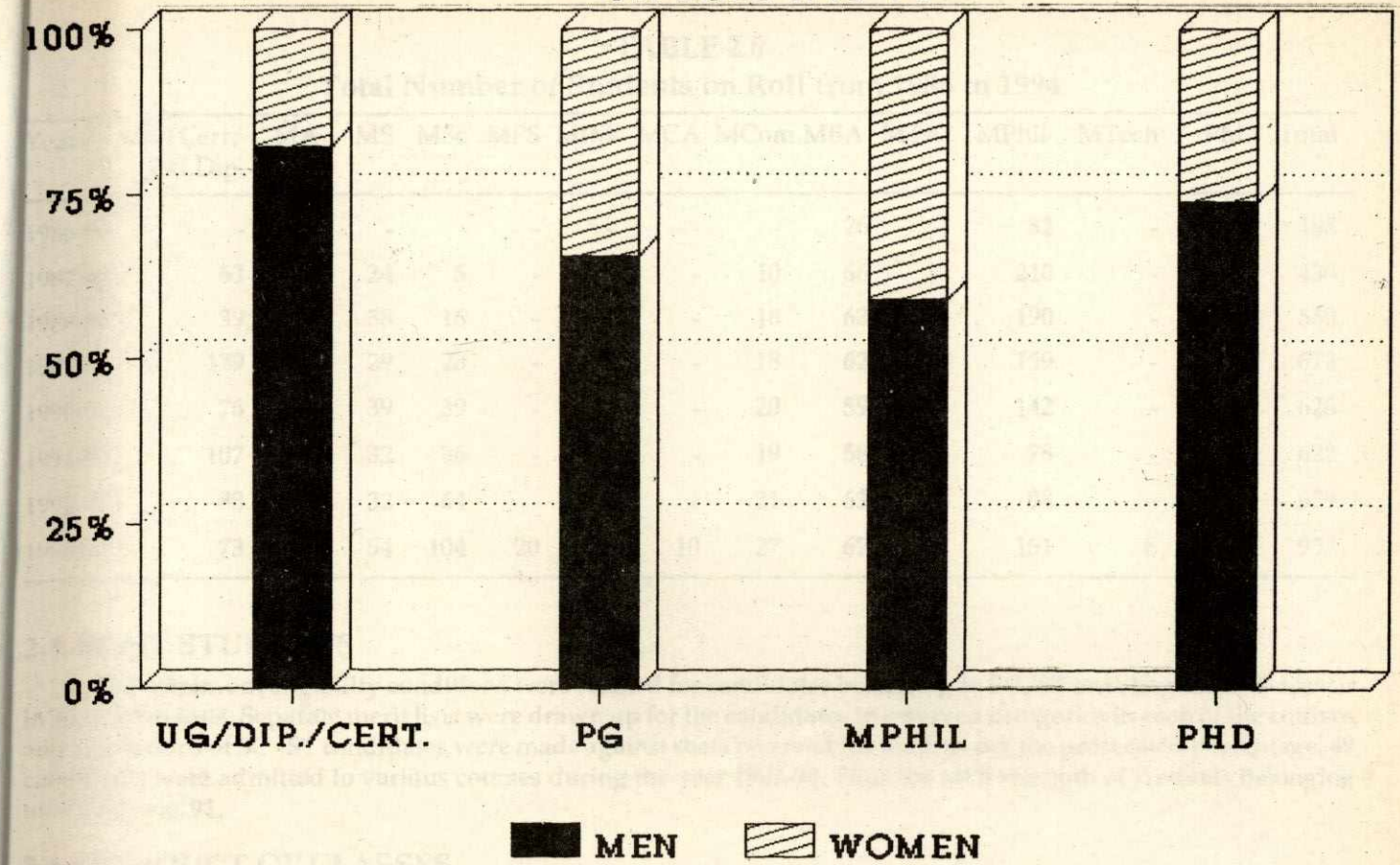
ADMISSIONS 1993-94 **GENERAL AND OTHER CATEGORIES** (Number of Students)



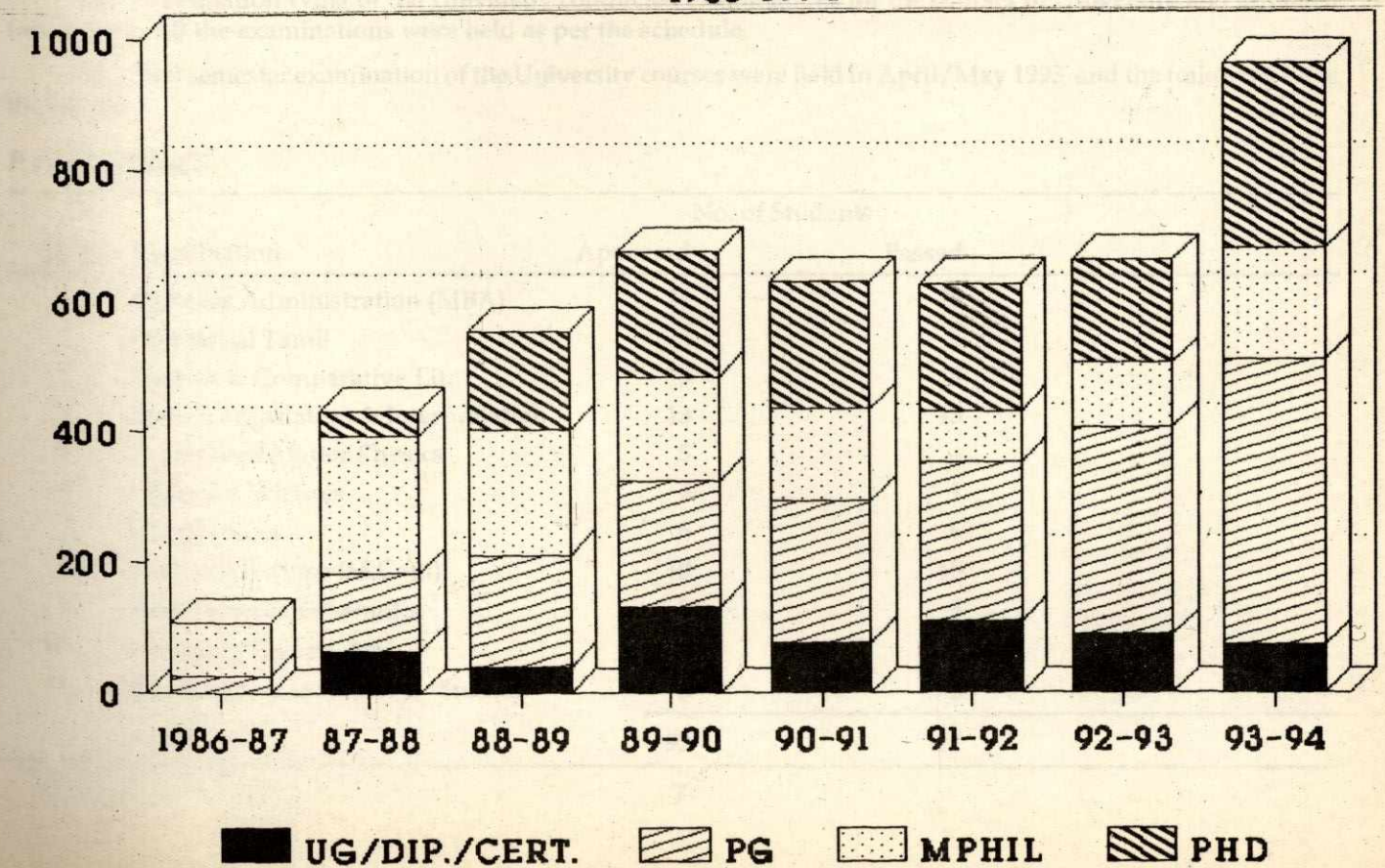
LEVELWISE COMPOSITION OF STUDENTS **ON ROLL 1993-94**

1986-1994

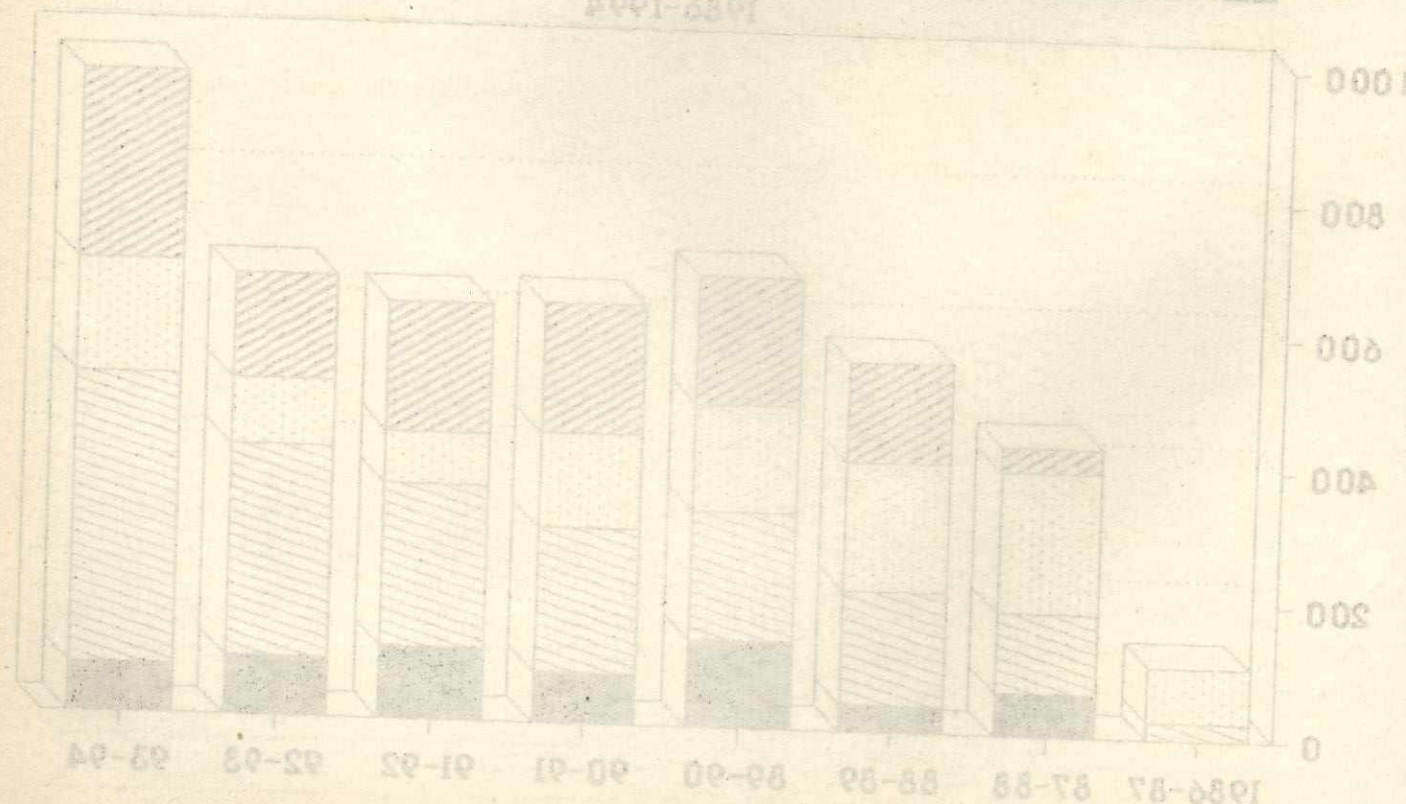

2.3. SC/ST STUDENTS

The minimum eligibility conditions were relaxed for candidates belonging to SC/ST enabling them to appear in admission tests. Separate merit lists were drawn up for the candidates in reserved categories in each of the courses and admissions of SC/ST candidates were made against seats reserved for them as per the prescribed percentage. 49 candidates were admitted to various courses during the year 1993-94. Thus the total strength of students belonging to SC/ST was 91.

2.4. CONDUCT OF CLASSES

The teaching and other academic activities were carried out throughout the year in a peaceful atmosphere without any disturbances.

2.5. EXAMINATION RESULTS

The Examination Wing of the University conducted examinations for the courses of University and affiliated institutions. All the examinations were held as per the schedule.

The UGC has sanctioned one post of Professor and a sum of Rs. 1 lakh for guest faculty for the introduction of MCA programme in this University. This programme has been commenced from the academic year 1993-94.

The Dept. of Bio-technology, Govt. of India has sanctioned a sum of Rs.20,500/- for holding Popular lectures in Biotechnology by eminent scientists in this University.

The first meeting of the Industry - Pondicherry University Research Co-operating Advisory Committee was held on 23.2.94 to interact with Industrialists and Bankers in order to mobilise funds for this University.

3.8. PROJECTS

During the period under report 16 Projects were sanctioned, the details of which are given in Annexure-I. With this, 50 Projects were under investigation in various departments.

3.9. HORTICULTURAL OPERATIONS

Planting of new tree saplings was taken up on a large scale basis in the University Campus and 1,10,934 saplings were planted during the year under report.

A new rose garden has been developed consisting of 180 varieties of roses.

The department participated in the flower, fruit and vegetable show conducted by the Department of Agriculture, Govt. of Pondicherry and won 19 prizes of which 10 are first and our University won overall second prize in the competition.

3.10. ANNUAL REPORT

The Annual Report 1992-93 of the University recommended by the Executive Council in its meeting held on 15.11.93 was approved by the Court in its meeting held on 23.12.93 and forwarded to the MHRD for placing the same in the Parliament.

New College

Tagore Arts College - Annexure-I was proposed to be started in July 1994. The Dean along with the Registrar inspected the proposed college.

The Dean is regularly corresponding with the authorities concerned to see that the college has the prescribed quota of teachers.

The Selection of College teachers for the award of UGC teacher fellowships was done by the College Development Council under the Chairmanship of the Vice-Chancellor. The Dean attended the selection committee meeting of the Bharathidasan Govt. College for Women, Pondicherry as per the directions of the UGC. Mr.S.Bhyravamurthy was selected for the award of the fellowship of Ph.D. under the faculty improvement programme.

The CDC conducted regular surveys of the affiliated colleges and maintains an upto date data profile in each college. The Dean is in constant touch with the Principals of the colleges and giving them necessary information and advice as per the guidelines of UGC.

The CDC has served as a useful co-ordinating unit between the colleges, UGC, State Govt., Central Govt. and the University during the year 1993-94.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO STUDENTS

6.1 Introduction

To help the students pursuing higher education, financial assistance is extended by various Organisations in the form of fellowship and scholarship. The details of fellowship and scholarships awarded to students during the period under report are given below:

6.2 UGC's Research Associateship

There are two Research Associates under UGC scheme, one Part-time Research Associateship at School of performing Arts (receiving a stipend @Rs.2,200/-p.m. with annual contingent grant of Rs.5,000/-p.a.) and another full-time Research Associateship at the Dept. of Ecology & Environmental Sciences receiving a stipend of Rs.2,200/-p.m. with an amount contingency of Rs.10,000/- during the period under report

6.3 Junior Research Fellowship and Research Associateship of UGC

The UGC has sanctioned 10 Junior Research Fellowship under the scheme "At any one given time basis". There were 28 JRFs during the period under report. The value of fellowship is Rs.1,800/- p.m. for the first two years and the same is enhanced to Rs.2,100/- p.m. for the next two years subject to fulfilling certain conditions laid down by the Commission. The fellowship is also extended by one more year on the recommendations of the Guide/Head of the Department/School. They are also eligible for a contingent grant of Rs.5,000/- p.a. in case of humanities and social sciences and Rs.7,500/- in the case of Science subjects.

An Engineering and Technology Fellowship was availed by a Ph.D. Scholar in the Centre for Pollution Control and Bio-Waste Energy during the period under report with a fellowship of Rs.2,500/- p.m. and a contingency grant of Rs.7,500/- p.a.

Besides there was one more candidate availing UGC JRF under the scheme of Direct award of fellowship to candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes category, which carried a fellowship of Rs.1,800/-p.m. and an annual contingency of Rs.7,500/- in the Department of Physics of the University, during the period 1993-94 (upto October 1993).

6.4 Bharathiar and Bharathidasan Research Fellowship

The Government of Pondicherry has created two research fellowship in this University in honour of the two great modern Tamil poets Bharathiar and Bharathidasan "On any one given time basis".

One candidate was getting fellowship @ Rs.1,800/- p.m. and a contingency amount of Rs.5,000/- p.a.

6.5 Government of Pondicherry Fellowship for doing Research in Tamil Language and Literature

Three Fellowships of the Government of Pondicherry were available to the students of Pondicherry Nativity for doing Ph.D. Full-time programme in Tamil Language and Literature with a fellowship of Rs.800/- p.m. and a contingency of Rs.3,000/- p.a. during 1993-94.

6.6 C.S.I.R. Junior/Senior Research Fellowship and Research Associateship

There are three CSIR JRFs & five Senior Research Fellows during the period under report. The JRF carries a fellowship of Rs.1,800/-p.m and SRF Rs.2,100/- p.m. Besides the fellowship, the scholars were eligible for a contingent grant of Rs.10,000/-p.a.

One CSIR Research Associateship is available at the Centre for Pollution Control and Bio-waste Energy availing associateship @ Rs.2,700/-p.m. from 1.10.93 and a contingent grant of Rs.10,000/-p.a.

6.7 Science and Technology Scholarship

The Department of Science and Technology, New Delhi, had awarded 9 Scholarships to the Students admitted to the Post-graduate Diploma in Science and Technology Communication course being offered in the ELT Centre, Department of English of the University. The value of the Scholarship was @Rs.400/- p.m. per student for a period of nine months of the course of study.

6.8. P.G. Diploma in Archival Studies Scholarship

UGC has awarded one scholarship to a student admitted for PG Diploma in Archival Studies course at the Department of History. The value of scholarship was @Rs.250/-p.m. for a period of 10 months of the course of study.

6.9 Teacher Fellowship to College Teachers under UGC Development Scheme

UGC had sanctioned Teacher Fellowship to 4 candidates for doing M.Phil programme at various Departments of the University under UGC development schemes for the year 1993-94.

6.10 ICHR Fellowship

ICHR, New Delhi, has awarded one fellowship to a Ph.D. Scholar at the Department of History for doing research which carries a fellowship of Rs.1,800/- p.m. and an annual contingent grant of Rs.5,000/-.

6.11 N.B.H.M. Scholarship to M.Sc. Students

The N.B.H.M, Bombay awarded three scholarship to M.Sc. students at the Department of Mathematics. The value of Scholarship is @Rs.700/-p.m. with an annual book grant of Rs.2,000/-.

6.12 Government of India SC/ST Scholarship

The Government of Tamil Nadu and Pondicherry sanctioned Government of India Scholarships to 12 students of SC Community for doing P.G and M.Phil programmes during the period under report.

6.13 Government of Pondicherry Scholarship

The Government of Pondicherry awarded eight scholarships to the natives of Pondicherry enrolled in various courses of the University for the academic year 1993-94.

6.14 ICHR Study cum Travel grant

ICHR, New Delhi had awarded study cum travel grant to two M.Phil scholars in the Department of History.

6.15 Scholarship to PH Students

The Director of Social Welfare Department, Government of Pondicherry has awarded 5 scholarships to Physically Handicapped students for the year 1993-94.

STUDENT AMENITIES AND ACTIVITIES

7.1. Hostel Accommodation

The two 60 Students hostels, one for MBA Students and the other for Students doing other courses sanctioned by the UGC as part of their seventh plan grant were constructed and thrown open for occupation on 16th July 1990. In addition to the above, a lady students hostel is functioning in the Campus in staff quarters. Due to heavy pressure of accommodation for lady students, three type V and two type IV quarters were also provided for hostel purpose. Two more hostels with 120 beds in each hostel is nearing completion for occupation for students. Out of these two hostels one is exclusively for lady students.

7.2. Hostel Administration

The University provided supporting staff to maintain hostel and hostel messes. The three hostels in the Campus is attached with the mess and each hostel has cook, Helper, Servers and Sweepers besides hostel office staff. Each hostel has a Deputy Warden and they are discharging their duties under the direction of Warden.

7.3. Hostel Mess

The Hostel Messes in the Campus are run by Mess Committees consisting of Students under the immediate supervision of Hostel warden. The Mess Committee members are elected by the Hostel residents periodically.

7.4. General Facilities

Each hostel is equipped with a colour television set and the facilities for indoor games such as Table Tennis, Chess and Carroms. Each hostel has a reading room. Important newspapers and magazines are supplied to each hostel. The University Health Centre offers medical facilities to the Students.

SPECIAL FACILITIES TO SC/ST AND WOMEN STUDENTS

8.1. Introduction

One of the important objectives of the programme of the University Grants Commission is to enable the belonging to the weaker sections of the society benefit from the facilities provided for them. The Commission sanctioned a Special Cell as a measure to strengthen the implementation machinery which plans the programmes for the welfare of SC/ST communities in this University.

The Special Cell as started in 1987 with the following staff which evaluates and monitors the schemes to be implemented:

This cell took all measures to find out whether all the schemes of the University pertaining to the welfare of SC/ST and Physically Handicapped categories are fully implemented. In addition, this cell also looked after the redressal of grievances of the SC/ST employees in this University.

8.2. Reservation for SC/ST and Physically Handicapped Candidates

As per the orders of the Government of India and the guidelines of the UGC with regard to reservation of seats for admission to candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Physically Handicapped categories 15%, 7.5% and 3% of the total number of seats in each course have been reserved for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Physically Handicapped students respectively. There is also provision for interchangeability of seats between Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates.

As per the Government of India's guidelines candidates belonging to SC/ST categories are to be given concession of 5% of marks in the qualifying examination prescribed for admission. If seats reserved for them remain unfilled, further relaxation should be given in order of merit among such candidates so that all the reserved seats may be filled. But as far as this University is concerned the candidates from SC/ST communities are considered for admission even if they possess a mere pass in the respective qualifying examinations prescribed for admission. Their cases are considered for admission according to the merit in the entrance test, among the Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes candidates. The Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe and Visually handicapped candidates are exempted from the payment of application fees for all the courses being offered in this University and also while applying for various posts.

Three percent of seats in each course are reserved for candidates from physically handicapped category. During the academic year 1993-94, five such students were admitted.

As per the guidelines of the University Grants Commission, a Standing Committee has been constituted to review the implementation of policies and programmes for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in Pondicherry University. Such a Committee has also been constituted in each of the affiliated institutions. The Standing Committee at the University level meets periodically every year.

The Deans of Schools and the Heads of Departments of this University and the Principals of the affiliated institutions were requested to follow strictly the guidelines of the Govt. of India and the UGC in respect of recruitment and are also being followed in this University. Instructions and guidelines received in this regard from the UGC/Ministry of Human Resource Development were circulated among the affiliated colleges/institutions then and there.

8.3. Admissions

During the period under report there were 480 students on the Roll in the first year in various courses of this University out of which 52 students belonged to SC/ST communities.

The details regarding the number of seats reserved, the number of candidates selected and admitted are given in Annexure-I. Particulars regarding admission of SC/ST candidates since 1986-87 are given in Annexure-II.

8.4. Scholarships

The respective State Government sanctioned the Govt. of India scholarship for the candidates belonging to the SC/ST communities, as per the guidelines of the award of scholarship. The scholarship includes reimbursement of examination and other non-refundable fees, besides the mess fees at the permitted hostel rates.

The details regarding the award of scholarship to the SC/ST students in the University during the academic year 1993-94 are given in Annexure-III.

8.5. Women Students

Out of 480 students admitted during the academic year 1993-94 in various first year courses in this University 169 students were women. This accounts to over 35% of the total admission. The details regarding admission of women students in various courses during the period under report are given in Annexure-IV.

9.1. UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

The University Central Library serves the students, research scholars, members of the faculty and nonteaching staff of the University. It functions on all the seven days of the week from 9.30 a.m. to 8.00 p.m. on week days and from 9.30 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. on weekly and other holidays. Reprographic and Photocopying facilities are provided to the students, research scholars and faculty. The University Library had a collection of 69,889 books and 1504 back volumes of journals and 475 journals were subscribed for the year 1993-94.

Grants:

An amount of Rs. 13,77,127/- (Renewal of journal subscription) under UGC Non-Plan Grant and another sum of Rs. 3,11,344/- under Annual Sub-Plan Grant from UGC were sanctioned and expenditure incurred for the purchase of books and subscription of journals for the year 1993-94. Further, an amount of Rs. 2.19 lakhs was sanctioned by NBHM towards purchase of books and journals for Mathematics Department.

Book Donation:

Various people/Institutions have, so far, donated 190 Nos. of Books to the Library.

U.N. Deposit Library:

The Library was recognised by the U.N. Organisation as its Deposit Centre.

Membership:

The Library had a total of 1,951 members on its roll, including the students, Research Scholars, Faculty, Officers and Non-Teaching Staff of the University. Several persons from other institutions have also used the Library for their research/study purposes.

Inter-Library Loan:

Inter-Library Loan facility was made available to the Faculty. Quite a number of books were received from various institutions on Inter-Library Loan basis for the benefit of the Faculty and Students.

Library Publications:

The University Library is publishing a monthly bulletin of recent additions viz. 'Book Alert'. It contains information about latest books acquired and available in the Library. The book alert helps the users to know the details of recent additions in various disciplines.

Binding:

1504 Nos. of back-volumes of journals were bound and kept for the use of students, Research Scholars and Faculty during the period under report.

Computer application to the Library:

A computer system has been purchased and installed in the University Library for automation of Library operation. Work on the creation of data base of books, journals and theses is in progress. The INFLIBNET Programme, Ahmedabad, have conducted a Workshop Training programme for the University Library Executives on 'Management of Computerised Libraries in Universities' and the first National Convention on Automation of Libraries in Higher Education and Research Institutes from 10.2.94 to 22.2.94 at Ahmedabad. Shri P. Ramanathan, Librarian participated in the workshop training programme and the National Convention on Automation of Libraries in Higher Education and Research Institutes.

9.4. UNIVERSITY SCIENCE INSTRUMENTATION CENTRE (USIC)

The USIC has started functioning from September 1992. The activities of the Centre is to cater to the Instrumentation needs of all the departments and centres of the University and also to the affiliated institutions.

The technical officers are involved in the servicing of various types of electrical, electronics, audio visual and other instruments that belong to different departments and centres.

They are also involved in design and development of proto type instruments/Circuits/modules for various instrumentation requirements for Labs and Projects. Electronic test instruments worth Rs.63,200/- have been purchased for the centre during the year 1993-94.

The centre is offering a course on Instrumentation to the students of science departments.

9.5. UNIVERSITY DISPENSARY

The University Dispensary started functioning from August 1989 with a view to give the medical cover to University students, staff and their family dependants. The University dispensary is rendering medical aid to Teachers, Non-teaching staff and their family dependants and students.

The dispensary is functioning in two places, one at Administrative Block, and another at Academic Complex. Patients are treated as out patient.

The Dispensary is handling all routine out-patient cases. For in-patient treatment and surgical interventions, patients are referred to Government General Hospital, Maternity Hospital and JIPMER. The necessary laboratory investigations to be done are being carried out by referring them to Government Hospitals and Private Nursing Homes.

Employees Medical Examinations at the time of appointment are carried out by the Medical Officers and also students Medical Examinations at the time of enrolling.
