

# FOREWORD

I have great pleasure in presenting the ninth annual report 1994-95 of the Pondicherry University. The University has made remarkable progress in a short span of time in establishing itself as one of the leading centres of higher learning and continued to do so during the year under report. The major achievements and activities of the University in the year 1994-95 are summarized in the chapter activities of the year" and the details are elaborated in the subsequent chapters.

The academic sector-schools and departments - continued to maintain the high standards inspite of several infrastructural constraints for their teaching and research. The University faculty strength which is hardly 135, has already attracted support for more than 60 research projects from various national and international support sand their output in terms of quality publications are impressive. As many as 118 papers have been published by them during the course of the year. As many as 32 teachers have participated and presented papers in nearly 56 seminars and symposia held both in India and abroad. The University itself had organized about 14 short term courses, seminars and conferences for the benefit of others.

The University administration including the Controller of Examinations Wing which caters to 20 affiliated institutions besides our University has been doing an excellent work and their record of fault-free functioning is indicative of their commitments.

The inventory of academic programmes listed in chapter 2, considering the early stage of its establishment of this University, can be considered as impressive in terms of diversity and wide choice available to the aspiring students.

We continue to have both annual and semester patterns of study and the University examinations are conducted for all the students from both affiliated institutions and the University and results declared as per schedule.

The chapter 3 outlines the major developmental activities both in the realm of academic programmes and in the area of infrastructure. Several buildings and campus amenity works undertaken earlier have been successfully completed this year and put to use immediately.

In the subsequent chapters the details of the staff strength, extra curricular and extension activities, the special efforts made to encourage underprivileged students and the like are given.

# HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

# 1.1 GENERAL

Being a young university, the need for development is great. Nothing could be given low priority and consequently, the resources and efforts are continuously mobilized for developing infrastructural, academic and extension activities in the year 1994-95. The salient points of the various developmental efforts are summarized in this chapter.

#### 1.2 ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

#### Schools, Departments and Centres:

The University has 6 Schools, 15 Departments and 8 Centres.

#### **New Courses:**

The following new courses were introduced:

Ph.D. - French

Environmental Engineering

Diploma/Certificate Course - Ling

Linguistics

Including the above courses, the Schools, Departments and Centres offered Ph.D. Programme in 21 disciplines, M.Phil Programme in 16 disciplines, PG Programme in 22 disciplines, PG Diploma in 3 disciplines, Certificate Programme in 2 disciplines and Five year integrated Master's degree Programme in one discipline.

#### Admission:

The intake of students during the year 1994-95 was 542. Out of this SC/ST was 68.

#### **Enrolment:**

The enrolment of the students in this year was 1168 which includes 96 students belonging to SC/ST. The above enrolment includes 720 Post-Graduate students, 158 M.Phil. students, 278 Ph.D. students and 12 PG Diploma and Certificate students.

#### **Hostel Students:**

The strength of the students in the Hostel was 425 which includes 265 men students and 160 women students. Out of the total, 57 were SC/ST students.

#### Faculty Position:

During the year under report 23 Professors, 55 Readers and 57 Lecturers were in different Schools, Departments and Centres.

#### Short-term courses/seminars/symposia conducted:

14 Short-term Courses, Seminars and Symposia were conducted in different schools, departments and centres of the University.

#### Seminars and Symposia attended by the Faculty:

32 Faculty members attended 56 seminars and symposia.

## 1.3 RESEARCH PROGRAMMES

#### **Doctoral Programme:**

16 Research Scholars registered for the Ph.D programme during the year.

#### Publication:

7 faculty members published 9 books.

38 faculty members contributed 118 papers and they were published in reputed national and international journals during the year.

#### Research Projects:

During the year under report 67 sponsored research projects were under execution in the University Schools and Departments.

9 University level books writing project were also under execution during the year.

# 1.4 DEVELOPMENTAL ACTIVITIES

#### Plan allocation:

During the period under report the UGC has released so far Rs. 603.99 lakhs for various schemes out of VIII Plan allocation of Rs. 1016.16 lakhs.

The intake of students during the year 1994-95 was 542. Out of this SC/ST was 68.

#### Library:

During the period under report 5106 volumes of books were purchased. With these, the Central Library acquired 74,995 volumes of books and 3609 back volumes of journals and subscribed for 392 journals and periodicals.

#### Finance:

During the financial year 1993-94, the UGC sanctioned and released Rs. 336.44 lakhs as non-plan grant.

The actual expenditure under non-plan for the year 1994-95 and the BE for the year 1995-96 were Rs. 519.84 and Rs. 605.02 lakhs respectively.

#### 1.5 AFFILIATED INSTITUTIONS

During the period under report affiliation was granted to the following new courses:

The Institutions offered a total number of 118 courses and there were 841 faculty members. A total of 10,329 students were on rolls of all the affiliated Institutions, of whom 4,888 were women students and 1,101 were SC/ST students. The total number of Library books in all these Institutions stood at 4,87,907 and subscribed for 1,424 journals.

# **ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES**

# 2.1 INTRODUCTION

The University offered Ph.D programme in 19 disciplines, M.Tech programme in one discipline, M.Phil programme in 15 disciplines, PG programme in 25 disciplines, PG Diploma programme in 1 discipline and Certificate course in 1 discipline in 6 Schools, 15 Departments and 8 Centres.

#### 2.2 ADMISSIONS

The University reopened after summer vacation on 1st July 1994. Advertisements for admission to various courses in the University were given in leading newspapers and admission tests were held for all the courses. Based on the performance in the written test, interview and previous academic record, students were admitted to various courses. Admission to all courses were completed as per schedule and the classes began on 1st July 1994. The details of admission in the first year and strength of the students in the subsequent years are given below.

# 2.3 SC/ST STUDENTS

The minimum eligibility conditions were relaxed for candidates belonging to SC/ST enabling them to appear in admission tests. Separate merit lists were drawn up for the candidates in reserved categories in each of the courses and admissions of SC/ST candidates were made against seats reserved for them as per the prescribed percentage. 68 Candidates were admitted to various courses during the year 1994-95.

# 2.4 CONDUCT OF CLASSES

The teaching and other academic activities were carried out throughout the year in a peaceful atmosphere without any disturbances.

# 2.5 EXAMINATION RESULTS

The Examination Wing of the University conducted examinations for the courses of University and affiliated institutions. All the examinations were held as per the schedule.

Each hostel is equiped with a colour television set, audio systems and facilities for indoor games such as able Tennis, Chess and Carroms. Each hostel has a reading room. Important newspapers and magazines are upplied to each hostel. The University Health Centre offers medical facilities to the Students.



### SPECIAL FACILITIES TO SC/ST AND WOME STUDEN

#### 8.1 Introduction

One of the important objectives of the programme of the University Grants Commission is to enable the belonging to the weaker sections of the society benefit from the facilities provided for them. The Commission 3.4 Scholarships sanctioned a Speical Cell as a measure to strengthen the implementation machinary which plans the program for the welfare of SC/ST communities in this University.

This cell took all measures to find out whether all the schemes of the University pertaining to the welfa the SC/ST and Physically Handicapped categories are fully implemented. In addition, this cell also looked a the redressal of grievances of the SC/ST employees in this University.

#### 8.2 Reservation for SC/ST and Physically Handicapped Candidates

As per the orders of the Government of India and the guidelines of the UGC with regard to reservation seats for admission to candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Physically Handicap categories, 15%, 7.5% and 3% of the total number of seats in each course have been reserved for Sched Cates, Scheduled Tribes, and Physically Handicapped students respectively. There is also provision interchangeability of seats between Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates.

As per the Government of India's guidelines candidates belonging to SC/ST categories are to be given as the second concession of 5% of marks in the qualifying examination prescribed for admission. If seats reserved for them remain unfilled, further relaxation should be given in order of merit among such candidates so that all the rese seats may be filled. But as far as this University is concerned the candidates from SC/ST communities considered for admission even if they posses a mere pass in the respective qualifying examina prescribed for admission. Their cases are considered for admission according to the merit in the entrance among the Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes candidates. The Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe and Vis handicapped candidates are exempted from the payment of application fees for all the courses being offer this University and also while applying for various posts.

Three percent of seats in each course are reserved for candidates from physically handicapped cate During the academic year 1994-95, five such students were admitted.

As per the guidelines of the University Grants Commission, a Standing Committee has been constituted review the implementation of policies and programmes for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in Pondic University . Such a Committee has also been constituted in each of the affiliated institutions. The State Committee at the University level meets periodically every year.

The Deans of Schools and the Heads of Departments of this University and the Principals of the affi institutions were requested to follow strictly the guidelines of the Govt, of India and the UGC in respect of recru are also being followed in this University. Instructions and guidelines received in this regard from the UGC/M of Human Resource Development were circulated among the affiliated colleges/institutions then and there

### .3 Admissions

During the period under report there were 542 students on the Roll in the first year in various courses of this niversity out of which 68 students belonged to SC/ST communities.

The details regarding the number of seats reserved, the number of candidates selected and admitted are ren in Annexure-I. Particulars regarding admission of SC/ST candiates since 1986-87 are given in Annexure II.

The respective State Government sanctioned the Govt. of India scholarship for the candidates belonging the SC/ST communities, as per the guidelines of the award of scholarship. The scholarship includes The Special Cell was started in 1987 with the following staff which evaluates and monitors the scheme eimbursement of examination and other non-refundable fees, besides the mess fees at the permitted hostel rates.

The details regarding the award of scholarship to the SC/ST students in the University during the academic ear 1994-95 are given in Annexure-III.

#### .5 Women Students

Out of 542 students admitted during the academic year 1994-95 in various first year courses in this University 68 students were women. This accounts to over 31% of the total admission. The details regarding admission women students in various courses during the period under report are given in Annexure-IV.

### 9.1. UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

The University Central Library serves the students, research scholars, members of the faculty and non teaching staff of the University. It functions on all the seven days of the week from 9.30 a.m. to 8.30 p.m. on week days and from 9.30 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. on weekly and other holidays. Reprographic and Photo copying facilities are provided to the students, research scholars and faculty. The University Library had a collection of 74,995 books and 3,609 back volumes of journals & 392 journals were subscribed for the year 1994-95.

#### Grants:

An amount of Rs. 10,96,130/- (Renewal of journal subscription) under UGC Non-Plan Grant and another sum of Rs.5 Lakhs under Annual Sub-Plan Grant from UGC were sanctioned and expenditure incurred for the purchase of books and subscription of journals for the year 1994-95. Further, an amount of Rs.2.19 Lakhs was sanctioned by NBHM towards purchase of books and journals for Mathematics Department. A sum of Rs.1 Crore was sanctioned by the UGC as Non-Plan Library Special Grant for purchase of Books, Back-volumes, Furniture & Equipments, Computer System, etc.

#### **Book Donation:**

Various people/Institutions have donated 9 Books to the University Library during the year.

#### U.N. Deposit Library:

The Library was recognised by the United Nations Organisation as its Deposit Centre.

The Library had a total of 2460 members on its roll including the students, Research Scholars, Faculty, Officers and Non-Teaching Staff of the University. 71 persons from other institutions have also used the Library for their research/study prupose.

#### Inter-Library Loan:

Inter-Library Loan facility was made available to the faculty and students. Quite a number of books were received from various institutions on Inter-Library Loan basis for the benefit of the Faculty and Students.

#### Binding:

3609 Nos. of Back-volumes of journals were bound and kept for the use of students, Research Scholars and Faculty during the period under report.

### Computer application to the Library:

The Library has purchased and installed the Computer system and CD-ROM Network Server (seven drives) was very much useful for research scholars, faculty and students. Bibliographic data of Books, Theses and Journal Holdings were computerised by using CDS/ISIS software.
