BACKGROUND

There is a growing need to look at disasters from a development perspective. Disasters can have devastating effect on communities and can significantly set back development efforts to a great extent. But then, it could also offer an opportunity to invest in development efforts in a post disaster scenario. Disasters are opportunities for communities to reinvent themselves.

One of the glaring lacunae in the process of Disaster Management in India has been the overlooking of unnatural disasters. Current global situation also demands initiatives in managing the impact of unnatural disasters and developments at the international level.

The global community has recognized the serious consequences of Nuclear, Biological and Chemical (NBC) warfare. Hence, unnatural disasters remain a serious challenge for India to address in the near future. The need of the hour is to chalk out a multipronged strategy for total disaster management comprising prevention, preparedness, response and recovery on the one hand and initiate development efforts, on the other.

Keeping in view the increasing new emerging challenges in disaster risk reduction, the training programme is intended to discuss the strategies for States to cope with the new emerging challenges in disaster risk reduction.

AIM OF TRAINING

This training -Emerging Challenges for Disaster Risk Reduction: New Strategy and 15th Finance Commissionis intended for officials of Health, Education, Panchayat Raj, Rural Development, Revenue, Women and Child Welfare, Police Department and any other relevant department officials and Students and faculty, State level sectoral departments, Administrative Training Institutions and civil society practitioners to help build their knowledge, skills and perspectives on new emerging challenges in disaster risk reduction.

OBJECTIVES

At the end of this course, participants will be able to:

- Explain the impacts of disaster on development
- Identify and list new emerging challenges in disaster risk reduction
- Explain the process of mainstreaming disaster risk reduction into development plan.
- Draft and apply strategies for the new emerging challenges in disaster risk reduction.

TARGET GROUP

This training programme targets officials working in Health, Education, Women and Child welfare, Revenue and Panchayat Raj and Rural Development Department. Though the training targets the government officials considering the contribution of civil servants, this training also targets Civil servants from Non-Government Organization.

PROGRAMME DETAILS

This training programme is scheduled for 3 days. It is based on e-learning module covering 2 hours each dayduring the programme.
