Regulations for Implementing NCC as an Elective Subject (With effect from the Academic Year 2024-2025 onwards)

Objective of the Papers

These papers provide a basic understanding of National Cadet Crops and its activities involved during the 3 years training period. These papers try to make students and cadets deliberate on various aspects of common and specialized subjects of various wings of NCC.

Eligibility Criteria for Registration

The registration for the first-semester paper is open to all students, including NCC cadets. The registration of papers offered from the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th semesters is confined to the cadets enrolled under three wings of NCC (i.e. Army, Navy and Air Wing). Since practical and attending camps are part of the papers, it is restricted to cadets.

Medium

The medium of instruction will be English.

Course Instructors

These courses need special training to the faculty members to teach. Hence, those institutions which has NCC wings are eligible to offer these papers, and dedicated Associate NCC Officers/Care Takers are eligible to handle these papers.

Practical Part as Internals

The weekly parades conducted at Institutions/Units shall be treated as internals and the same shall be assessed for 25 marks

Submission of Camp Certificate

Cadets registering for 3rd and 5th semester electives shall submit the camp certificate to get extra 5 credits. In case if they fail to submit the same, they will get only 2 credits after successfully completing the paper.

Examination Pattern and Passing Minimum

Examination and passing minimum and grading are as per the existing NEP regulations of the Pondicherry University. i.e Internals and End Semester.
